Mayor Dunn Not Seeking Re-Election

(TEMPLE, TX – January 19, 2018) Temple Mayor Daniel A. Dunn announced last night that he will not seek re-election in the May 5 election.

Mayor Dunn has served the city for the past five years in his current role as Mayor and served the 3 years previous as Councilmember for District 1.

“It has been the greatest honor to serve the City of Temple for eight years, first as a council member and then as Mayor,” Dunn said in a statement. “Temple is my home and my first love. I wanted to serve as Mayor since I was a boy and my wife, Alicia and my family as a whole has helped me make that possible.”

During Mayor Dunn’s tenure on the Council, Temple has experienced unprecedented growth and made significant investments in transportation infrastructure, parks, public safety initiatives, and utility improvements.

“Every person who is elected to public office hopes to leave the place better than they found it, because of the good folks I’ve had the privilege to serve with on past and present councils I am able to walk away feeling a great sense of fulfillment,” Dunn stated.

Mayor Dunn plans to continue to work, volunteer and be an active part of the Temple community. He also plans to attend graduate school and hopes to eventually teach and pursue his lifelong interest in writing.
